


Welcome!



First things first...


The wifi code is INTERSTELLAR (all caps)
This works for both the Casa Stellar 2,4gH and 5 gH wifi.

We have a very good wifi connection with top speeds of about 400 Mbps (yes, up and down) but we actually hope you won't need it. For the best connection

The property manager has provided you with the code to the house and also 2 keysets. Always turn on the alarm when leaving the house, if not you are liable.

Please also remember to turn off all the appliances, music, and especially the air conditioning.




You are not on camera!

There are 2 outdoor sensors and 1 indoor sensor. These are equipped with a camera function but for GDPR reasons only take a picture when the alarm is ON and the motion sensor of the unit gets activated (for instance, when someone would climb over the wall when the alarm is activated).







Solar power

Only 2% of Ibiza's power supply comes from renewable energy sources. The other 98% is coming from fossil fuels, gas, and energy from waste. Since this island does not have an unlimited power supply and neither does the house, we installed solar panels to make sure we are always 'ON'. The system is combined with a huge battery pack to make even more use of what the sun can give us.

If the power does go down, first turn everything off and look for the 2 electric boards underneath the stairs. There is 1 for the house, and 1 for the solar installation. One of the switches will be down, pull it back up and the power should be back.

None of the switches are down? Take a look around to see if the neighbors still have power if not then the communal power is down. Nothing else to do but sit back and maybe light a candle if it's nighttime. These power outages never last long.

If you need help, call our house management team, they are standby 24/7.

To make the most of our solar energy, use the dishwasher and other appliances when the sun is high and the moon is low.

Water supply

Ibiza's water supply comes from two sources; the first is an extensive pipeline of underground lakes, also known as aquifers, that sit under a layer of porous limestone. These aquifers provide almost half of the water consumed on the island. The second is a network of desalination plants that work to filter out salt from water.

While this island is surrounded by water, the supplies are not unlimited.


But not to worry, we got you covered!

We have installed a water reservoir behind the bbq area. That will keep you happy for a few days if anything were to happen with the water supply from the street.



While Ibiza's tap water is safe to drink, it does not always taste great. That is why we have a filter installed in the fridge for purified tap water, or you can find the 5L bottles in each supermarket.





Pool

Tim aka 'the pool guy' comes every week, usually on Friday. Please let him in, he is Australian and very friendly.

For small children: we have a pool alarm, you can find it next to the vault in the first kitchen cabinet.

Keep in mind that we are not responsible for any accidents or injuries that happen on the premises.

We have plastic cups to be used at the pool. We know, we all like

to drink our rosé out off an actual wine glass, but you will see, the wind often makes this a bit of a challenge...

And please: DO NOT JUMP OFF THE BALCONY.


This seems to be a national sport in Ibiza, with many injuries and even deaths, but as you may have noticed, we have a very shallow plunge pool. It will hurt. Towely

We provide each guest with a small face towel, a normal towel, a big towel, and a pool towel.

These can not be removed from the house. If lost, they will be charged.

The fridge

We have a huge freezer/fridge in which you can stock up food and drinks for an entire week.

The water from the fridge is filtered, this also makes the ice cubes so you don't have to worry, all is drinkable.

OUR FRIDGE POLICY:

Everything that is left behind and is unopened and unspoiled we keep for the next guests. This way we don't have the throw out edible food.

Our property managers can only eat so much you know..;)



It would be a shame not to use the bbq, but keep in mind to clean it after use.

During the turnover for the next guests there is no time to do this, so if not cleaned we need to charge you €150. This will be deducted from your deposit.

Out of gas? There is always an extra bottle in the cupboard next to the bbq.
But please advise the property manager so they can replace it for the next guests.





You might be wondering why the garbage bins are so small?

That is because the best thing to do is to empty them every day. There are A LOT of ants around and they really like everything we leave behind. There is really no way to avoid them execpt to take away what they like.


The communal bins are at the corner with the main road (by Can Pa and the supermarket)
They are divided into:
Cardboard &paper / Glass / PMD / ALL

DELIVERY APP - ALFRED IBIZA:

Will bring you anything from food and alcohol to groceries and pharmacy products. Download from the App Store or Google Play.





Ibiza has a very strict alcohol limit: A blood alcohol level of 0.5 grams per litre. (Or a breath alcohol level of 0.25 mg per litre)

During the high season you will see a lot of traffic police and Guardia Civil checking tourists for papers or drunk driving. They have about 4 months to fill their quota and make sure the annual 'Policemen's ball' is a lavish one, so you be warned!

USE THE TAXI IBIZA APP:

It works about the same way as Uber, but keep an eye on it, the drivers are known to cancel rides. They sometimes just pick up someone else along the way...

Ask them to pick you up at Bistro Can Pa or the supermarket on carrer Cala Vadella norte, they are more likely to arrive or give you a good price when they are sure about the location and it is something they know.



Tellyfish

Depending in the currents, Ibiza's waters can be populated with a species we do not particularly like: jellyfish. What we see mostly here are the brown-purple type that is called 'pelagia noctiluca'.

You can often see local children playing with them, but do not be mistaken, they sting like a motherf*****.

IS THERE AN APP FOR THAT?

Yes, there is. It is called 'Medusas Ibiza'.



It works like the traffic apps that report speed camera's. Anyone on the island can report jellyfish if they are spotted at the beach and people on the island really do use it.

So do not waste your precious time driving to a beach you can't swim at, but check the app.





Vino rojado

Ibiza is known for many things but a good rosé wine or 'coppa de vino rosado' is not one of them.

As rosé wine enthousiasts we have kept a record of what is good and what is not.

Covid test centers

In the case you need to get tested to fly or drive home, here is a list of reliable test centers on the island. All the test centers do PCR and antigen tests. PCR is mostly done with saliva here, so it is less intrusive.

Many of them also offer an 'at home testing service'. They will come to your house or wherever you are at that moment and send you the results by email the next day.

This way you can get the most out of your stay on the island. It takes about 10-15 min.


Discover Ibiza

Ibiza (old) town

You can not come to Ibiza and not visit Eivissa and the old town. The town is buzzing with all kinds of different people, from stylish fashionistas and savvy restaurateurs to ex-hippies and DJs who've chosen the island's capital as their home, plus born-and-bred locals who've never ventured outside of town.

The international jetset and yachting communities hobnob in their natural habitat, Marina Botafoch, while the family-friendly urban beaches play host to young, fun and VIP holidaymakers.

After dark, edgy creatures of the night frequent the port area and the gay-friendly back streets of Sa Penya come alive with a multitude of colourful characters.





Perched high atop a hill, creating a striking skyline that has become an iconic vision of Ibiza is the ancient walled fortress of Dalt Vila. The UNESCO World Heritage Listed site is a treasure trove of cobbled streets (many only accessible on foot), cathedrals, chapels and churches plus a selection of museums including an archaeological museum and the slick Museum of Contemporary Art.

Las Dalias

There are many hippy markets, second hand markets and forada's (local specialties) on the island. Each on a different day of the week, so during the summer you can hop from market to market, day after day.

A favourite for holidaymakers and island residents alike, is Las Dalias. A colourful event with shopping, people watching, healthy food and much more. You can buy clothing, jewellery, craftwork, musical instruments, CDs, household items, accessories, paintings, books, hammocks, handmade shoes, incense, antiques, etc.

There is a restaurant, several drinking spots and live music. If you're lucky there might even be a party going on!



Secret spot This secret spot is only a few minutes away from Casa Stellar.

It's hidden very deep within the urbanisation of Calo d'en Real and it's not something you stumble upon by accident. But it is perfect for a morning or evening walk since it is only 15 min by foot.


We don't know what it is or was. It seems to be the ruins of some kind of small party venue. You can see there used to be a bar, a bbq, water and electricity.



Boattrip

If there is one thing we do every time we come to the island, it is to take a boat trip...

There are many ways to do this and many routes to follow, but this is what we like to do:

11 am: Departure from Port Es Torrent or San Antonio harbour to discover the west coast of the island 2 pm: Lunch on Playa Illetes on Formentera 4pm: Sail to the island of Espalmador 5pm-sunset: Discover the small bays along the west coast and sail back to harbour

The Rave Cave

15 min drive from Casa Stellar

The actual name of this spot is Cova de sa Figuera Borda, but many refer to it as 'The Rave cave' because of the secret (and also illegal) parties that are hosted here.


No one knows when these parties are, but the spot is also a perfect sunset apero location, so grab some drinks and bites and follow this route to get there:

Set your GPS to Cala Comte. Just before you get there, turn left by the garbage containers onto the parking lot and keep driving for about 400m until you see a villa. Follow the path to the left side towards the power cabine.



If you have a 4x4 car you can keep driving, if not park your car here and continue by foot.

Walk along the coastline for about 250m untill you see the stone stairway that descends towards the cave...







Formentera by car

If you are a fan of crystal clear waters and endless white sandy beaches, then Formentera is for you. Ibiza's smaller sister is a little bit more posh (no party peeps here) and makes you think you are on a Caribbean island for the day.

Although only 19 km long this island is filled with culinary treats and the most beautiful beaches.

What we recommend:

Drive your car (or scooter, in summer season they block tourist cars because of the overload) on the ferry (Balearia or Trasmapi) in the morning. It takes 30 min to go from Ibiza port to Formentera.

Make your pick of these:

- Visit the Faro de la Mola
- Beachclub 10.7
- Cala Saona
- Calo des Mort



End the day at Pirata Bus. Have a drink, enjoy the sunset and music and head back to La Savina port to catch the last ferry back to Ibiza.

Festival Club

Have you ever been to a legendary but abandoned club from the '70?

It's called Festival club and it was the original and first super club of Ibiza.

The old club was built as an amfitheater, it had many different bars and restaurants and even a bull fighting arena. At that time there was no gps so you needed a guide or a local to bring you to this crazy club.

Halfway the '70 it shut down due to the oil crisis and it has never opened since.

Most of it has been taken back by nature and the graffiti artists that are always around, but you can still imagine the Rolling Stones playing here....





WHERE?

It's hidden in the hills of Sant Joseph, only 15 min from Casa Stellar and you can easily find it on Waze if you look for 'festival club' or just type this code on Google maps: W8J3+HX Sant Josep de sa Talaia, Spain.






Make sure the light on top of the speaker is put on TV (use 'input' on the remote to switch modes)

UE BOOM WIRELESS SPEAKER

- 1 Press the power button.
- 2 To pair WONDERBOOM 2 with your mobile device, press and hold the Bluetooth button until you hear the tone.
- Go to the Bluetooth settings on your mobile device and select WONDERBOOM 2 from the list.
- 4 Once WONDERBOOM 2 is on and connected to your mobile device, just hit play to begin streaming your music.
- 5 You can control the volume from your mobile device, or directly from your WONDERBOOM 2 by pressing the "+" or "-" button.

RECORD PLAYER

The record player is connected to a bluetooth transmitter for output. To use the record player the Bluetooth transmitter needs to be connected to the soundbar, follow these steps:

- 1 Activate the record player by turning the switch to "on".
- 2 Activate the Bluetooth transmitter by pressing 3s on the central top button.
- Turn on the soundbar and choose Bluetooth (if not activated automatically)
- The flashing light on the Bluetooth receiver should now be blue and ready to transmit
- (5) Pick a record of choice and enjoy your music!

(You can change the volume with the sounbar remote)

POOLALARM


You can find the pool alarm next to the safe in the first kitchen cabinet together with the user manual.

There are 3 bracelets and a siren that alarms you if the electrodes (6) from the bracelet make contact with water. To turn off the siren, press the button on the right-hand side of the siren(4).

All of them are battery-operated, always test before use. If they don't work, call our house management, they will replace the batteries or help you to reconnect the bracelets to the siren.







WASHER/DRYER

- 1 Turn on the washer/dryer (1).
- 2 Most of the programs on the washer/dryer are simply washer programs except for the last 3 on the programme knob (4).
- 3 Turn the programme knob to the program you want to use and -if wanted- add options on the right (5) by simply pushing the name of the option. Not all options are available, it depends on the programme you have chosen.
- 4 Press start (2). Good to go.

House rules # Invetory

House rules

GENERAL

- All Guests (and any Visitors) must comply with all House Rules and any other instructions from the Property Manager during their stay; and
- II. Guests must notify the Property Manager of any disputes or complaints from neighbors as soon as reasonably practicable.

The Homeowners are not responsible for any accidents, injuries or illness that occurs while on the premises or its facilities. The Homeowners are not responsible for the loss of personal belongings or valuables of the guest. By accepting this reservation, it is agreed that all guests are expressly assuming the risk of any harm arising from their use of the premises or others whom they invite to use the premise.

Keep the property and all furnishings in good order. Only use appliances for their intended uses.

NOISE AND THE NEIGHBORHOOD

- Guests are fully responsible for the safety and security of their children at all times, as well as any disturbance caused to other residents in the Neighborhood;
- II. Guests and Visitors must keep noise to a minimum as not to disturb the occupants of neighboring properties especially during nighttime hours (e.g. 11pm 8am), and upon arrival and departure;
- III. Excessive noise is prohibited at all times and may result in termination of the vacation rental agreement, eviction, loss of rental paid and extra charges which may be deducted from the Security Deposit;

VISITORS

- Guests are allowed a maximum of 8 Visitors at any time during their stay. Any Visitor on the property is the sole responsibility of Guest.
- II. Guests are responsible for ensuring maximum visitor numbers are not exceeded; and that visitors are complicit with these House Rules.
- III. Visitors are not allowed to stay overnight
- IV. Guests can not oppose the visit of the premises if the landlord or property manager makes the request.

FUNCTIONS

- I. Parties and large gatherings of any kind are strictly prohibited at the Vacation Rental; and
- II. Any small gathering must comply with other rules set regarding Noise, the Neighborhood and maximum Visitor numbers.

SMOKING

Smoking is NOT allowed inside the house. Smoking is allowed outside only. Cigarette butts must be disposed of properly (i.e. in ashtray provided) and not thrown on property grounds. Failure to do so will result in a deduction from the security deposit.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING

Guests and their Visitors are to dispose of Garbage and are expected to Recycle in accordance with Spanish regulations. For long term rentals, garbage disposal is mandatry at least 2 times per week to avoid pests and insects.

PETS

Pets are NOT allowed inside the house or on the property.

LINNEN AND TOWELS

There is no daily housekeeping service. While linens and bath towels are included in the unit, daily maid service is not included in the rental rate. We suggest you bring beach towels. We do not permit towels or linens to be taken from the house.

SECURITY

Any time Guests leave the Vacation Rental, it is their responsibility to ensure all windows and doors are closed/locked to maintain security and prevent rain and water damage. To prevent burglary and theft the alarm system should be activated when Guests leave the property at night

Guests must switch off lights, air conditioning, fans, electronics such as televisions when not in use to promote energy saving. It is not permitted to leave the air conditioning on when Guests are absent from the Vacation Rental.

SWIMMING POOL

Children and babies must be supervised at all time while using the pool. Homeowners are not responsible for any accidents.

For safety reasons, it is not permitted to use any glassware in or around the pool area. Failure to comply with this rule will result in a fine deducted from the security deposit.

BARBECUE

Barbecue activities can only take place in the provide area (underneath the porch). Is is not allowed to remove the barbecue to any other location. Barbecue cleaning in not included and if not cleaned by the Guest an additional charge of €150 will be deducted from deposit fee.

DAMAGES AND BREAKAGES

- All Damages and Breakages must be reported to the Property Manager as soon as reasonably practicable. Failure to report them will likely result in a penalty deduction from the security deposit. And;
- II. To avoid Damages and Breakages, no furniture is to be moved from one room to another without prior agreement. Also;
- III. No bathroom towels are to be removed from the property (i.e. for beach use). Separate beach towels are provided for this purpose.
